Gas'n'Go

If you're looking for relief from the high cost of gas, take a vacation! To lure guests, some inns and big-chain hotels are offering free gas cards to guests arriving by auto. A good place to start: Visit www.bedandbreakfast.com and click on "Free Gas Promotion" for a list of incentives by innkeepers in the United States and Canada. If you prefer the chains, ask about promotions when booking. At some Best Westerns, a three-night stay gets you a \$50 gas card; when booking online, use promotion code Gas50. At some Hilton Hotels, including the Santa Fe Hilton, you can get a \$20 gas card for each night's stay.

Savvy Search

Internet search engines are great for finding information. But at many popular search engines such as Yahoo and Google, results may be skewed by companies that pay for "sponsored links." So you may wind up paying for something that would be free at another site. For example, a fee credit report can be found at AnnualCreditReport.com, but other sites that charge may be listed first. Before you click on any link, you might want to check if the site is from an advertiser. And, on any site, don't forget to read the fine print. Even better, if you want to go to a specific site and have its address, bypass the search engine and type the URL directly into the top field of your browser. At any website, make sure it's the one you want before entering private information.

Skunks

Skunks are members of the weasel family. There are four species of skunks in North America: striped skunks, hooded skunks, spotted skunks and scarce hog-nosed skunks. Striped skunks measure 20 to 30 inches long (including the wide, bushy tail) and weigh 6 to 10 pounds and have two wide, white stripes on their backs that meet on the head. Spotted skunks are about half that size with white spots instead of stripes. Skunks have small heads and eyes, pointed snouts, and short legs that make them excellent diggers. They tend to be slow-moving animals, never in much of a hurry, and are generally poor climbers. A litter of from one to seven young, averaging five, is born from late April to early June. Skunks are generally nocturnal and begin foraging at sunset. They are omnivorous and help keep the rodent population in check. They often travel five to ten miles within their territory at night looking for field mice and other small rodents as well as lizards, frogs, birds, eggs, garbage, acorns and fallen fruit. They also dig for insects, especially beetles, larvae and earthworms. Their diet includes black widow spiders and scorpions. Being carrion eaters, they help keep roadways and neighborhoods clean. An estimated 70% of a skunk's diet consists of insects considered harmful to humans.
