Slick Tricks in a Can

What will you find in 8 out of 10 U.S. homes? Along with duct tape and super glue, most homes will have a can of WD-40 on hand, but most people could not guess all the possible uses for it.

WD-40 was developed in 1953 by Norm Larsen to eliminate water and prevent corrosion on electrical circuitry and was first used on the Atlas missile. It has become the jack-of-all trades that cleans, penetrates, protects and lubricates as well. It became commercially available in 1958. The WD-40 manufacturer sponsors an annual contest for do-it-yourselfers to come up with even more ways to use it. One winner sprayed her parakeet's feet with WD-40 to release it from sticky mousetrap paper. Another sprayed his guitar strings to play faster.

Here are just a few useful uses:

- Takes the itch and sting out of red and fire ant bites.
- Removes grease, roofing cement, rubber caulking, glue and pine pitch from hands.
- Dries and removes rust, grease and grime and prevents rust and squeaks from tools and chains.
- Keeps wooden handles splinter-free.
- Loosens bolts and screws and makes screws easier to drive.
- Cleans varnish brushes and nozzles on spray paint cans.
- Protects saw blades from rust and makes cutting easier.
- Removes buildup on sanding belts.
- Prevents rain seepage when sprayed on garage door seals.
- Helps thread electrical wires through flexible conduit when sprayed on wires.
- Lubricates glass cutting tools, garage door openers, and blades of rotary mowers.
- Removes oil spots from driveways.
- Releases gummed-up cruise controls.
- Cleans spark plugs, brake cables, jammed throttles, whitewall tires and chrome.
- Removes pine sap, bugs and black grease from vinyl or velour seats.
- Frees triggers, push-button light switches, stove controls and tuners on stereos.
- Softens and waterproofs leather on shoes, boots and baseball gloves.
- Removes scuff marks, rust, gum and stubborn stains from carpets, linoleum and tile floors.
- Removes dirt and grime from sliding glass door tracks, sewing machines, barbecue grills, bathroom and kitchen fixtures.
