

Minutes from the NLLOA Board Meeting
April 13, 2004

The NLLOA Board Meeting started promptly at 7pm by NLLOA President Kent Conner. Kent presented an agenda for the meeting.

6 of 7 board members were at the meeting. Trish Hightower was not available at meeting time. There was one visitor, Elmer Friedrich.

Ed presented membership information to the board. Renewals will be given to Trish in the near future. There were discussions on previously used forms for membership and for restriction issues.

Bob Redoutey presented the previous meetings notes for board approval. They were reviewed and approved to be placed on the web site.

Ed Pastor presented information on Security issues for the area. Sign down at Sunset and Valley View. The county was out quickly to fix the sign. Ed has asked a former Williamson County Sheriff officer to help him with security in the area. Although he could not make this meeting, he will be working with Ed on security issues for North Lake.

Elmer Friedrich was introduced to the board. The board introduced themselves and welcomed him to the meeting. Elmer was present to discuss the problems in the neighborhood with wild dogs attacking and killing his goats.

Kent presented information to Ed that the crime reports will be start being sent to the NLLOA P.O. Box.

There was a short discussion about a couple of dogs that were hit on 2338, as reported by the property owner in the vicinity. One dog was killed at the scene; the other died a short time later at a vet's office in Round Rock.

Kent and Mike discussed current restriction issues were discussed including property on FM 2338, Deck, Cherokee, Mockingbird and Kyle. Issues included zoning, proper amount of masonry, storage buildings and initial plans to build.

Bob Redoutey gave status on the newsletter and plans to finalize for board approval. Information given for newsletter articles. Discussions on newsletter size, printing and distribution

Kent and Debbie talked about highway clean up along 3405 including available bags, vests and procedures. There is currently no set dates for clean up, but regular patrols are done and trash picked up as needed.
