**Fall Feast for the Birds**

Spread this mixture onto an empty sunflower head:

1 cup water	½ cup peanut butter
Yellow cornmeal	Wild birdseed
½ cup coats	

Boil water and mix in just enough cornmeal to cook into a soft mixture. Remove from heat and add oats, peanut butter and birdseed. Make sure the mixture doesn't get too thick. Press into sunflower heads and hang from a tree or bird feeder.
